WHAT IS AN HONORARY DEGREE?

An honorary degree is an academic degree for which a university has waived all of the usual requirements.

Bishop Gcebe is urging church leaders not to accept bogus honorary degrees from academic institutions that are not registered and accredited to offer those qualifications.

What is the purpos of honorary degrees?:

Universities do not always award honorary degrees for the purpose of honouring a person's exceptional achievement



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WHO GETS AN HONORARY DOCTORATE?: The Honorary Doctorate Degree is conferred upon distinguished Archbishops, Bishops, Pastors, Evangelists, Ministers, and other Christian Leaders who have made significant contributions in their respective fields. There have been many cases in which honorary degrees have been awarded by institutions that are **not registered and not recognised** by the South African Department of Education.

Who deserves an honorary religious degree?

An Honorary religious degree is awarded in recognition of an individual's religious work in contribution to the Church ministry and significant contributions to the community service and in active Christian service, and the exemplary qualifications of those individuals in their field of service.

INCREASE OF BOGUS RELIGIOUS HONORARY DEGREES IN SOUTH AFRICA

In South Africa there is an increase of Institutions offering fake honorary degrees and church leaders are the victims of these practices. It is costly to pay for something that is not recognised and it is also an embarrassment for senior church leaders.

It can happen that church leaders are not aware that they are scammed and these honorary doctorates does not carry any value. Likewise some church leaders may be aware of the scam but still want the title of being a "Dr or Professor".

HOW TO CHECK IF A COLLEGE OR INSTITUTION IS REGISTERED AND ACCREDITED:

1. Head on over to the Department of Education website to see whether the college is listed there.

2. Alternatively, you can email: RegistrarFET@doe.gov.za to find out about a college and their status.

The final component of a college's **accreditation** has to do with the fact that Umalusi has to verify the college's accreditation. You can contact Umalusi on the following details:

In South Africa, one such accreditation is awarded by SANAS – the South African National Accreditation System. SANAS looks at the qualifications of the lecturers (did they study to teach FET, and what did they qualify in), the quality of the institution and services they offer (admin, financial support, etc.), the textbooks they use and base their lectures on (the content and accuracy of it). They also check the quality of the laboratories and facilities.

From there on. there are numerous accreditation bodies responsible for accrediting specific courses offered by a college and other education institutions. Each sector or industry in SA has a SETA (Sector Educational and Training Authority) that acts as an accreditation body. Accreditation is essential for education, and that's why all universities are accredited. They HAVE to meet local standards since most universities are internationally accredited too. SANAS and the DHET award and accredit universities based on international standards. This is to ensure that all higher learning institutions offer qualifications that are of the same level.
