International Saint John Church conducted The Seven (7) Last Words of Jesus Christ Workshop on Saturday, 18 April 2025 at 04 Henry Williams Road Thaba Tshwane, Pretoria.

The youth presented the 14 stations of the cross: the final moments from Jesus's condemnation to death to His burial (via Dolorosa).

The preachers took turns to explain the seven sayings of Jesus on the cross
